Concerns the safety, health or well being of a horse and/or rider; B. Materially benefits PHBA's programs or its financial stability; or C. Involves other compelling circumstances.

**554. A. A PB must be produced from the breeding of at least one PHBA regular registered parent and the other parent is required to be from the list of PHBA breed registries. Its sire and/or dam are registered in PHBA. The produce shall meet all previously mentioned registration requirements.**

**B. A registered PB can be bred to a registered PB and if that produce is ineligible for the regular registry in PHBA, then that produce will be eligible for registration as a PB. The produce shall meet all previously mentioned registration requirements.**

#### Reasons for rule change:

***This rule change is a win win for PHBA by increasing registrations, memberships and show entries. PHBA Affiliates stand to grow as does the parent organization. When a PB is bred to a PB, statistically there a great chance for that produce to be a Palomino. Both parents are 50% Palomino themselves.***
