PALOMINO BRED ADDITIONAL ELIGIBLE HORSES

Horses with a Palomino Base Coat and other qualifying characteristics as required in Rules 503, 504, 505, 506 but are ineligible for regular registration due to excessive body white as outlined in Rules 503.B.3 and 512.A,B,C,D may be eligible for Palomino Bred Registration under this clause, regardless of sire/dam color when both sire and dam are ineligible for Regular Registry. Registration requirements for Additional Eligible Palomino Bred registry that must be met are Rules 521, 552, 553, 555, 556.

Justification:

This clause adds registrations of previously unregistrable horses to the Palomino Bred registry. As written, it should not jeopardize the Palomino Bred's NSBA color status as the horses who would become eligible for PB registration are already NSBA color eligible thru their primary registration. It maintains the integrity and history of our Palomino color breed while also maintaining our rules in regards to body color found throughout our rulebook and counted as a percentage of the score in many classes. It also preserves the identity of excessive white horses who have already qualified and are showing in the Palomino Bred division. It generates growth in the Palomino Bred division both in registrations and in entries at APA shows and the World Show.
