Use to submit a rule change proposal (must be postmarked 120 days prior to convention) A rule or regulations is not subject to amendment by change, addition or repeal, until it has been in force for at least two calendar years, which limitations may be waived by the Executive Board upon finding extraordinary circumstances: A. Concerns the safety, health or well being of a horse and/or rider; B. Materially benefits PHBA's programs or it financial stability; or C. Involves other compelling circumstances.

Recommendation for change-

Unregistered palomino colored horses Geldings and spayed mares

548. The owner must submit supply

A. four (4) color photographs (front, back, and each side of the horse). These pictures become the property of PHBA.

B. A written letter, or electronic transmission, from a licensed veterinarian on their official letterhead, stating proof of age, sex, and current ownership. Must be submitted at time of application and signed by submitting veterinarian.

Justification for change-

We do register recognized breed assoc. palomino colored horses, but some are sold through sales or private treaty without papers. Or simply lost from owner to owner. This proposal would allow palomino colored horses without papers to register PHBA. They would still have to meet our registration guidelines as spelled out in the rule book. They still must submit colored photographs. An inspector will still be sent out if questions arise. In addition, they must submit an affidavit by a licensed veterinarian, stating age, sex, and ownership. Any ancestry or bloodlines will not be shown on the papers. We do not recognize our own papers as a recognized breed (and should not IMO) except for the PB horses. They can show in NSBA color classes and SB pinto. NSBA has also adopted this phrasing. Allowing these horses a set of papers, records another palomino horse while generating growth of PHBA membership (our mission statement), registration revenue, and hopefully APA revenue.
