See the history of "A" shows attached. Our number of "A" shows has been declining since 2015. Exhibitors look for "A" shows because the likelihood of classes they wish to show in will make. This is really as dependent on the number of entries as well as the number of horses. The revenue source for the association is our shows.
Estimated revenue to association with rule change WILL INCREASE REVENUE

Estimated expense to association with rule change NONE

This will encourage people to attend shows and increase participation at shows which may not have 60 horses. Increased participation means increased revenue for APA's and the Association. This more accurately reflects competition at shows and points earned. This should be adopted immediately, as it will have a positive financial impact on the association.

3065 Rule change: Changing the definition of an "A" show from 60 horses to "60 horses or 300 entries will qualify as an 'A' show".

How the Proposed Rule would read if accepted is set forth below. The new wording appears in italics and bolded.

HORSE SHOW CLASSIFICATION

3065. Shows shall be classified according to the number of horses entered and shown in all PHBA approved classes.

A. A Class "A" show shall have sixty (60) or more different horses shown at *or three hundred (300) entries or more shown in* halter or in performance classes.

B. A Class "B" show shall have fifty-nine (59) or less different horses shown at *or less than three hundred (300) entries shown in* halter or in performance classes.

C. Horses entered in group halter classes, Rule(s) 365-3369, only will be included in determining the classification of a show.

HISTORY OF "A" SHOWS:

Year 2019: Had 5 Class "A" shows under the current rule. These were:

World Show;

Windom Minn. in May 2019 had 63 horses and 324 entries

Iowa Falls Oct. 2019 had 68 horses and 348 entries

New Castle Ind. 2019 had 70 horses and 400 entries

Iowa Falls June 2019 had 70 horses and 376

With the proposed rule change there would have been 1 (one) additional "A" show which would have been New Castle Ind with 50 horses and 300 entries.

Year 2018: Had 4 Class "A" shows under the current rule. These were:

Colorbreed in Nov. 2018 had 62 horses and 268 entries

Iowa Falls Oct 2018 had 80 horses and 420 entries

World show

Iowa Falls in May 2018 had 63 horses and 299 entries

With the proposed rule change there would have been 2 (two) additional "A" shows which would have been Meridian Miss.in December 2018 with 30 horses and 358 entries and the Meridian Miss. in Oct 2018 with 30 horses and 333 entries.

Year 2017: Had 6 Class "A" shows under the current rule. These were:

Colorbreed in Nov. 2017 had 93 horses and 316 entries

Iowa Falls in Oct. 2017 had 73 horses and 403 entries

New Castle Ind. In August 2017 had 67 horses and 410 entries

World Show

Iowa Falls in June 2017 had 60 horses and 365 entries

New Castle Ind in May 2017 had 63 horses and 348 entries

With the proposed rule change there would have been 3 (three) additional "A" shows which would have been Meridian Miss. in Oct. 2017 with 32 horses and 327 entries; Windom Minn. in May 2017 with 50 head and 325 entries; and Verona Miss. in May of 2017 with 45 head and 355 entries.

Year 2016: Had 7 Class "A" shows under the current rule. These were:

Colorbreed in Nov. 2016 with 96 horses and 389 entries
Iowa Falls in Oct. 2016 with 81 horses and 464 entries
Windom Minn in August 2016 with 69 horses and 307 entries
World Show
New Castle Ind. in May 2016 with 62 horses and 297 entries
Iowa Falls in June 2016 with 69 horses and 324 entries
Fort Worth Texas in Feb 2016 with 64 horses and 390 entries

With the proposed rule change there would have been 3 (three) additional "A" shows which would have been Verona Miss. in Oct. 2016 with 47 horses and 340 entries; Windom Minn. in May 2016 with 57 horses and 300 entries; and Verona Miss. in April 2017 with 47 horses and 325 entries.

Year 2015: Had 8 Class "A" shows under the current rule. These were:

Colorbreed in Nov. 2015 with 99 horses and 401 entries
Go for the Gold (Okla.) in Sept 2015 with 73 horses and 305 entries
Iowa Falls in Oct 2015 with 91 horses and 502 entries
Windom Minn in Aug. 2015 with 61 horses and 285 entries
World Show
Iowa Falls in June 2015 with 69 horses and 463 entries
Athens Tex. in June 2015 with 61 horses and 348 entries
Fort Worth Tex. in Feb 2015 with 60 horses and 313 entries

With the proposed rule change there would have been 7 (seven) additional "A" shows which would have been Verona Miss. in Oct. 2015 with 50 horses and 369 entries; Athens Tex. in Oct. 2015 with 48 horses and 311 entries; New Castle Ind. in August 2015 with 53 horses and 370 entries; Athens Tex. in Sept. 2015 with 58 head and 319 entries; Wisconsin in August 2015 with 51 horses and 370 entries; New Jersey in May 2015 with 43 horses and 330 entries; and Verona Miss in April 2015 with 55 horses and 373 entries.

Data for earlier years would be incomplete as many of the show result listings did not include the relevant information.

As can be seen from this information, our "A" shows have been declining each year over the last five years with one exception. By changing this rule we provide our exhibitors the opportunity to exhibit at an "A" show while driving revenue into the APA's and the Association.
