A rule or regulations is not subject to amendment by change, addition or repeal, until it has been in force for at least two calendar years, which limitations may be waived by the Executive Board upon finding extraordinary circumstances: A. Concerns the safety, health or well being of a horse and/or rider; B. Materially benefits PHBA's programs or its financial stability; or C. Involves other compelling circumstances.

horse in any class.

Originator's justification for change and impact if not passed: (Proposal will be return if not completed)

I feel and have heard MANY OTHERS say that it is unfair to allow exhibitors  
to show more than one (1) horse per class regardless of the class, why should  
certain classes allow multiple horses to be shown by same exhibitor & others not. Especially  
now with the 2 horses makes 1 point rule in effect, this rule is really turning the  
tables in favor of those riding multiple horses as they are often riding horses that are already marked so  
no add'l revenue for the show, it allows for pulling  
of one's own class with the ability (minus judging factor)  
to enter with this new rule in effect. YO choose which horse you want to get the points

Estimated revenue to association with rule change

\* possibly to gain entry money with more people going in classes  
if people are each only allowed to ride one (1) horse.

\* possibly less overtime pay for larger/larger shows \* judges & office if multiple horses per  
rider not allowed.
