A rule or regulations is not subject to amendment by change, addition or repeal, until it has been in force for at least two calendar years, which limitations may be waived by the Executive Board upon finding extraordinary circumstances: **A.** Concerns the safety, health or well-being of a horse and/or rider; **B.** Materially benefits PHBA's programs or its financial stability; or **C.** Involves other compelling circumstances.

horse in any class.

than one (1) horse per class. Why should certain classes allow multiple horses to be shown
by the same exhibitor & others not. Especially now with 2 horses makes 1 point rule in effect.
This rule really ~~disadvantages~~ ^{favours} those riding multiple horses as they are often riding horses that are Maxed out
so no addtl. revenue for the APA. It allows for padding of ones own class with the ability (comping) judges further
to choose which horse you want to get the points.
