-The World Show

The PHBA will lose Affiliates due to no Affiliate Events, and/or participation. Competitors have no need to compete locally. All they have to do is load up and go to the world show. Our local affiliates are the backbone of the PHBA. The local Affiliates stand for the PHBA. We spread the word, we are the PHBA. We need a way to build our local Affiliates, and to do so make them, our local shows, a qualifying show. The prestige of a qualifying show will build the reputation of the show, and will bring out some of the "Big Guns." One trainer told me, "why do I have to come to your show?' Louisiana, for example, is an East-West through fare (I-20) in the northern part of the state and I-10 in the southern part of the state. I am sure our other Affiliates have similar Interstate connections, so travel logistics would not be a problem. A "qualifying show" would also help not only the local affiliate economically, but help the local area economically. I refer the economic Impact study by the AQHA. Making the world show a qualifying show can and would be only proactive, not only for the local affiliates, but the PHBA as well. Lose Affiliates, lose interest, all negative. We have to be proactive and make the PHBA world show a qualifying show.

Attachment B

In order to estimate revenue to PHBA with rule change—make the World Show a qualifying show, I refer to the economic Impact math formula done by AQHA!

It states:

Number of horses x3 (people per horse) x show days + 1 day move-in and 1 day move-out X \$150 per day.

Example:

1 horse x3 people x3 (1 Event/Day and 1 in day and 1 out day) x \$150.00 per day= \$1,350.

These money's reflect moneys going directly to the PHBA. It includes entry fees, office fees and also to the arena complex and to the local economy via gas, hotel and food. I have only calculated one (1) horse.

We need to be pro-active and make the PHBA World Show a qualifying show.
