A motion was made to excuse Mike Bendele. Motion passed.

Motion made to take agenda out of order. Motion passed.

Minutes approved with correction. Motion Passed

Minutes of March 20, 2022 read. Correction of paragraph 10 All Aged Palomino Bred class... Motion made for approval with correction. Motion Passed

Terri Green reviewed the Our Board Member Hat and role of the General Manager as found on page 14 of our booklet.

Terri reviewed the role of the Executive Board at our World Show on page 15 of our booklet. Our role is summed up as "Goodwill Ambassadors of PHBA".

Terri reviewed the awards for the world show to date on page 16. A discussion regarding funding of Terry Furnish Open Longe Line trophy; Melonie's goal is have it funded through donations.

New one included the Amateur Western Pleasure trophy in memory of Sandy Walker. A perpetual trophy will be placed in PHBA Office. Owner's trophy will be funded for life by Sharon Baumgaret (Sandy's sister).

A payout for Open Color class in memory of Jim Mulhausen is in the process of being established.

A discussion regarding needed improvement on the Champion Trail Shootout flyer when enlargement of it is done.

Paula, a Springfield Representative from Convention Bureau visited with the Executive Board regarding ideas for the World Show special events.

Mike Benedele joined us at 5:30 p.m.

Terri Green gave an update regarding the convention. Enrolled 128 registered. Friday night meal served 120 individuals. Saturday night had 125 individual attending. At present cost is in the black \$57.57. A bill is to be given to the Heritage Foundation for their portion of the event; thus a larger income will be made by PHBA.

Following a lengthy discussion regarding difficulty serving donuts and coffee; a motion was made for the executive board not to do coffee and donuts at the world show. Motion Passed

Terri Green reported that Mark Harrell will design trail patterns for world show. Jeff Ohler will be at the world show to oversee the running of trail classes.

Mimsi Roe Coon gave a report on the WS project: Open-5 classes and 2 FP ads for \$2,100. Amateur - 4 classes and 4 FP ads \$2,180. Youth – 26 classes and 16 FP ads for \$14,515. Other - 5 classes and 14.5 FP ads for \$4,415. Grand total is 35 classes and 36.5 FP ads for \$23,210. A motion to accept report. Passed

A budget of \$1000 will be used to purchase eight fire tablets and \$500 to purchase software to use at world show. First year use will be for the judges' card reporting. A motion made to proceed with purchase. Motion Passed.

Review of the roping event found on page 19 with the flyer on page 20. Mike gave a review of information from Oklahoma Quarter Horse Association Spring Show he stopped in Tulsa. Mike handed out flyers at the show before attending the board meeting. \$3500 raised for roping event payout. A motion to accept report. Passed

At 6:30 p.m. A motion made to recess till Monday.

Monday morning the executive board members meet at the fairgrounds with Joe. Several items were discussed regarding changes for the world show. Joe was left with a list of items to check on and call Terri Green with the information. A change in location of the stalling office will be an easier access for the exhibitors.

A motion made to resume our meeting at 10:42 a.m. Passed.

Lynn Rohwedder reviewed the financial report with the group. There were three new line items added to the balance sheet: 3208 is the amount for the Youth Buckle Drive; 3211 is the sponsorships for the cattle classic; and 2177 is the amateur fund to help with activities at the world show and help to offset the difference on balance sheet with PHBA. Terri also pointed out the cost of one photographer at \$450. The high cost of meals at the convention of \$7075. A motion made to accept the financial report. Passed

Discussion followed regarding our next meeting. May 4th, the first Wednesday, a conference calls to be held at 7:30 central time. Merle Arbo will assist in setting up this meeting as a Zoom Meeting. Merle will email all the connection information.

Terri Green received information from Paula regarding the world show: Abe Lincoln and wife will be at one of the youth function. Also the Convention Bureau is going to give \$1,000 toward the amateur/open activity. She will also give other information to Terri Green. Terri will be receiving information about Beef and Pork groups to assist with meat and cooking.

Discussion followed regarding the 2023 location for the PHBA Convention. Dates considered are March 1-5 or 8-12. A motion made to remain in Tulsa for the convention. Passed. An additional motion made for Terri Green to ask for hotel comps in Tulsa. Passed.

A motion made at 11:52 to recess till 1:00 p.m. Passed

At 1:05 motion made to resume the meeting. Passed

The youth advisor Tia Koehler called in to visit with the executive board discussing the plans regarding activities at world show. The youth plan on presenting colors and singing prior start of the show. May 18 at 7:00 p.m. will be a youth meeting by conference call. President Craun asked to receive a copy of the youth minutes.

Amateur President Shelly Rystrom called in to relay information from the amateurs. The group would like to expand the ice cream social to an evening street activity at the world show. Plans would like to include a supper, ice cream and a Hee Haw singing and dance for the evening of July 13.

Ranch riding buckles. One for each amateur division as Diane Kuntz did last year. The amateur board would like to do this for the English, Western and Hi-point game horse. After some discussion it was decided the other three division would be worked on for next year start to provide time for a three year sponsorship commitment and proper advertising.

2022 RULE CHANGES

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 6

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETINGS AND METHOD OF VOTING

Section 1. Executive Board Meetings. The Executive Board shall meet at such times and places as whenever and wherever called by the President may direct, or it may meet at the call of any five (5) of its members acting jointly. The most efficient methods of communication appropriate for conducting professional affairs/business may be utilized.

A. For regular meetings <u>or conference calls</u>, a ten (10) day or greater <u>written</u> notice shall be <u>mailed given</u> by the Secretary/Treasurer <u>or General Manger</u> to all members of the Executive Board. Adequate notice shall be ten (10) days for any special meeting.

B. <u>Conference calls and/or other electronic meeting options are acceptable means of conducting a meeting.</u>

B<u>C.</u> A quorum shall consist of five (5) members of the Board

C-D. Each member is entitled to one (1) vote, and a majority of those present is required to pass any motion, except those requiring a two-thirds (2/3) vote.

Section 2. Mail, Facsimile, Electronic Mail Ballots. <u>Remote Voting</u>. "Vote by Mail or Facsimile or Electronic Mail" other efficient and appropriate method of conducting business procedure may be used by the Executive Board on any matter. <u>Exception</u>: except that no financial obligation shall be thus approved unless same has been budgeted or for which funds are available from the PHBA reserve or surplus.

A. The procedure requires that each Executive Board member as well as PHBA receive a clear and concise statement, of the subject to be voted upon, and that each member attest his/her vote by his/her signature, and send a copy of same to both PHBA and the officer who has initiated the vote.

B. The results of the voting, when properly conducted, shall have the same force and effect as though resulting from an Executive Board meeting. <u>All such votes must be duly entered in PHBA records (i.e. Minutes).</u>

Section 3. Meetings. The Executive Board shall meet at such times and places as the President may direct, or it may meet at the call of any five (5) of its members.

A. Conference calls and/or other electronic meeting options are acceptable means of conducting a meeting.

B. Adequate notice shall be ten (10) days for any teleconference or special meeting. For regular meetings, a ten (10) day or greater notice shall be mailed by the Secretary/Treasurer to all members of the Executive Board.

C. A quorum shall consist of five (5) members of the Board.

Cremello's shown in regular registry class would not be eligible to show in the Palomino Bred classes and vice versa.

B. Violation of this rule shall disqualify the horse(s) from the competition at the discretion of the judge <u>or show</u> manager. At the discretion of the judge <u>or show manager</u>, the entry may not be counted as an entry in the class;

C. Padding classes: A judge shall not count in his/her class count any horse/exhibitor that is disqualified for failure to do the required class procedure and who is obviously padding the class not raise the point total.

Payment of entry fees or other expenses by any person other than the amateur or those persons found in **Rule(s) 5205** is to be considered remuneration;

NOVICE YOUTH PROGRAM

6021. Novice Youth Eligibility. A person is considered a Novice Youth exhibitor by PHBA when a youth has met all the following qualifications for the previous five (5) calendar years.

A. Exhibitors cannot have earned a total of one hundred (100) or more lifetime performance more than 30 50 Youth points or 50 Novice Youth points in all <u>a class in</u> PHBA divisions or programs (i.e. Open, Youth, Novice Youth) combined. <u>or other breeds.</u>

1) Halter, color, longe line, leadline, hunter in hand, parade, walk-trot and points from classes not offered in the Novice division are not used are not used in calculating Novice Youth status;

B. The Novice Youth cannot have won a World Champion title in PHBA; EXCEPTION: halter, color, longe line, leadline, hunter in hand, parade, walk-trot and Novice Youth classes any breed in the class;

C. The Novice Youth cannot have won a World Champion title in any other equine organization; EXCEPTION: halter, color, longe line and Novice Youth classes;

D. The Novice Youth cannot have carned more than twenty-five (25) points in any other equine organization; EXCEPTION: halter, color, longe line classes;

AQHA RULE CHANGES

EQUIPMENT

3312. Any equipment and/or bit considered legal in an PHBA-approved class may be used on any horse for training purposes on show grounds, whether or not the horse will be shown in the class for which the equipment and/or it is legal; for example, equipment and/or bits legal for barrel racing classes may be used on horses of other disciplines for training on the show grounds. 3320 B. Mouthpieces. Bars must be round, oval, egg-shaped, smooth and unwrapped metal of five-sixteenth (5/16") to three-fourth (3/4") inch (8-10 mm) in diameter, measured one (1") inch (25 mm) from the cheek. However, wire on the sway bars (above the bars and attaching to the spade) of a traditional spade bit is acceptable. They may be inlaid, but must be smooth or latex wrapped. Nothing may protrude below the mouthpiece (bar), such as extensions or upward prongs on solid mouthpieces. A three piece, connecting ring of one and one-fourth $(1 \ 1/4")$ inches (32 mm) or less in diameter, or a connecting flat bar of three-eights (3/8") inches to three-fourth (3/4") inches (8-10 mm), measured top to bottom with a maximum length of two (2") inches (50 mm), which lies flat in the horse's mouth is acceptable. A linked mouthpiece with minimum 3/8" (10 mm) diameter that is smooth with movable links that are solidly attached to the shanks;

E. PROHIBITED OBSTACLES: Tarps, water obstacles with slick bottoms, PVC pipe used as a jump or walk over, tires, rocking or moving bridges, <u>painted loges or poles</u>, logs elevated in a manner that permits such to roll in a dangerous manner.

F. MANDATORY OBSTACLES AND MANUEVERS

1. Ride over obstacles on the ground <u>(natural logs are **strongly recommended**</u>). Walk, trot or lope may be used but only one gait is required.

When a lead change is a required maneuver, it may be designated as a simple change or the exhibitor has the option to perform either a simple or flying lead change.

H. The position of the exhibitor and performance of the horse and rider on the rail must be considered in the final placing.

LONGE LINE

3398. Attire. Conventional Western attire is mandatory; except if a prospect is considered to be a Hunter prospect then conventional English attire is suggested. <u>(flat caps and fedoras are also acceptable)</u>. The type of attire worn by the exhibitor is not to be a consideration in placing the horse as long as the attire meets the requirements stated above. **Committee: Accepted**

National Directors: Accepted EB Motion to accept. ACCEPTED

3387. An exhibitor may show only one two horse in the longe line class.

3407. An exhibitor may only show one two horses in each longe line class. The same exhibitor must show both segments of the class. An additional handler may hold the second horse while the first horse is being worked. An additional handler may hold the first horse while the second horse is being worked. A maximum of two handlers may be used. In Amateur classes, any additional handlers must hold a current PHBA Amateur card. Exhibitors and handlers may not do anything to disturb any horses in the class while they change handlers, however if an exhibitor must exit the arena prior to the placings another exhibitor properly attired and wearing the correct number may standin once the conformation and longeing presentation is complete.

3417. Penalties and disqualifications:

b) Disqualification will occur in the following instances:

3) Fall to the ground by horse. A horse is deemed to have fallen when its shoulder and/or hip and/or underline

AQHA Rule – Performance Halter

SHW365.3 The following horses are the only horses eligible to compete in the performance halter class: SHW365.3.1 horses that have earned a Racing Register of Merit;

SHW365.3.2 horses that have earned a Performance Register of Merit prior to January 1, 2010; and SHW365.3.3 horses that earn a Performance Register of Merit after January 1, 2010 so long as their record reflects that they have earned at least 5 or more AQHA Performance Points during their career in competitions other than Showmanship at Halter. For example, a horse earned 6 Showmanship at Halter points and 4 Western Pleasure points for a total of 10 points to achieve the Performance Register of Merit. If the Performance Register of Merit was earned prior to January 1, 2010, the horse is eligible to compete in a performance halter class. However, if it was earned after January 1, 2010, the horse must earn one more AQHA Performance Point in a class other than

Showmanship at Halter to be eligible to compete in a performance halter class.

SHW365.3.4 horses which are competing in a performance class at the same show may also be shown in performance halter. Horses must be ridden or driven at that show. Walk/Trot classes and showmanship at halter do not count as an eligible performance class.

Motion made for the WS exemption. PASSED

Note: The world show should be exempt. Horses should have to have an ROM on their record to compete at the world show in performance halter.

A motion made that all show rules follow AQHA effective immediately that pertain to PHBA show rules be accepted. PASSED
